Did You Know....

- ◆ Historians claim that the first valentine was a poem sent in 1415 by Charles, Duke of Orleans, to his wife. He was imprisoned in the Tower of London at the time.
- ◆ The first train was designed by Richard Trevithick and took its first run in England on February 21, 1804. It moved at a speed of 8 kilometers, or 5 miles per hour.
- ◆ Congress prohibited dueling in the District of Columbia on February 20, 1839.
- ◆ The first telephone book ever issued contained only 50 names. It was published in New Haven, Connecticut, by the New Haven District Telephone Company in February, 1878.
- ◆ Fred W. Woolworth opened the world's first five-'n'-dime store on February 22, 1879.
- ◆ In February 1912, new U.S. football rules were put into motion. The playing field was shortened from 110 yards to 100 yards, a touchdown would count for six points instead of five, four downs were allowed instead of three, and the kick-off was moved from midfield to the 40-yard line.
- ◆ Buddy Holly, Ritchie Valens and the Big Bopper died in a plane crash on February 3, 1959.
- ◆ The Beatles' first US concert was in Washington DC on February 11, 1964.
- ◆ Barbara Jo Rubin became the first female jockey to win a horse race on February 22, 1969. She rode Cohesian to victory at Charlestown Racetrack in West Virginia.
